The data collection technique in this study uses documentation sourced from primary data in the movie Birds of Prey. The analysis technique uses Roland Barthes' qualitative descriptive theory and semiotics, and the use of post-feminist theory. Taking the subject refers to the figure of Harley Quinn by looking through denotative terms that explain the relationship between the marker and the marker in reality, resulting in an explicit meaning. Connotations explain the relationship of markers and markers with non-reality, generating implicit meanings and myths explaining the customs and beliefs that prevail in society. The analysis shows that there are signs and markers of the message in this film that are portrayed with humiliation, gender injustice, and unyielding attitudes by women who fight for their rights. There are also elements of women's emancipation, that women must be equal to men in any way, such as acting, behavior, speech, and mindset. Reject the notion that women are weak people who need protection from a man. Fil Bird's of Prey is a call for women's equality through film.

This then causes a polemic because it provides a different picture of female characters in a film work (Manesah et al., 2018). 2. Research Methods

The method used in this research is a qualitative descriptive method. The qualitative descriptive method is a research approach used to research natural objects, where the researcher is the key instrument, the data collection technique is carried out in a triangulation manner, the data analysis is inductive and the results of qualitative research emphasize meaning rather than generalization (Sugiyono, 2014). Meanwhile, Harley Quinn herself chose to live with Cassandra Cain.

There is an ego side portrayed by Harley Quinn in this Birds of Prey movie. This is shown by the scene where Harley Quinn kills several Zionist men who want to kill her. This is done by Harley Quinn to protect herself even though she knows that her actions violate government rules.

Although not officially incorporated into Birds of Prey, Detective Montoya is forced to help them protect Cassandra Cain from the Black Mask. Another important thing, Montoya is used to working with Huntress. Before Renee became Question, she was one of the honest cops in Gotham City.



Cassandra Fabric

Cassandra as an adopted child who turned pickpocket to fund her lifestyle. And although he was very good at pickpocketing and retaliating, he didn't seem to possess any supernatural powers.

The meaning of the connotation contained in the scene is to feel dissatisfied with the justice system in his city. Montoya and his friends form their own group to eradicate evil.

The myth contained in the scene is that women can be strong figures who seek justice and equality between men and women. Postfeminism is considered as a mainstream feminism driven by various commercial interests without a clear feminist activity or agenda. In this case, the third wave of feminism declares itself as a feminism that develops in the academic world, is systematic and more critical (Suwastini, 2019).

The form of postfeminism that Harley Quinn applies views that women should actually be equal to men in any way. From her own perspective, Harley Quinn rejects the notion that women are the ones who need protection from men. Building the power produced by women is possible, because power is the right of every human being, including women.

The heroic actions here seem to have an implied message and contain elements of post-feminism, because basically this film invites women to carry out self-liberation actions and not to harass the ideology that has been firmly held by a woman.

4. Conclusion
